# TAKE CHARGE of your HEALTH

## Sleep Apnea is a Snore

**SLEEP APNEA CAN LEAD TO SERIOUS HEALTH PROBLEMS AND CAN GREATLY INCREASE THE RISK OF AN EARLY DEATH, PARTICULARLY IN AFRICAN AMERICANS, PACIFIC ISLANDERS AND MEXICANS.**

We've all had those days when we just don't feel as well rested as we should. Our eyelids droop. We yawn. We may even nod off at our desk or on the bus ride home. Some feel this exhaustion only occasionally. For others, it is a daily experience. And that could be a sign of a serious health problem called sleep apnea.

Sleep apnea is a chronic condition in which a person stops breathing in their sleep many times a night. There are three types of sleep apnea, but according to Sam Fleishman, M.D., Director of Sleep Medicine and Behavioral Health at Cape Fear Valley Health, obstructive sleep apnea is the most common type.

"the carbon dioxide in the body increases as oxygen decreases. This sends an alert to the brain, which then releases adrenaline throughout the body. This drives up your blood pressure."

The more severe the sleep apnea is, the more obstructions a person experiences and the less likely the blood pressure will dip back down to a normal level.

"If you don't treat the sleep apnea, it's hard to get the blood pressure down," said Dr. Fleishman.

Another danger of untreated sleep apnea is the development of diabetes.

"When you sleep, your tongue and the soft palette at the roof of your mouth relax," Dr. Fleishman said. "These can then drop down and obstruct your airway, preventing you from getting enough air into your lungs."

Because of the soft tissue blocking the airway, snoring is an indication that you may have sleep apnea.

"It's much like when you let the air out of a balloon," Dr. Fleishman said. "When you hold the neck and release the air it makes a flapping sound. This can also happen when tissue obstructs the airway during sleep, causing one to snore."

Left untreated, sleep apnea can lead to serious health problems and can greatly increase the risk of an early death, particularly in African Americans, Pacific Islanders and Mexicans.

"Sleep apnea can cause significant impact on your cardiovascular system," Dr. Fleishman said. "It can increase your risk factors for high blood pressure, heart disease, stroke and heart arrhythmias. It can shorten your life span significantly."

How can lack of sleep cause your blood pressure to increase?

"If you're having airway obstructions all night," said Dr. Fleishman,

"About 50 to 70 percent of people with type 2 diabetes have obstructive sleep apnea," said Dr. Fleishman. "When people have sleep apnea, it actually has an impact on their metabolism."

According to Dr. Fleishman, when you have sleep apnea, your body's leptin levels go down. Leptin is a hormone that affects your appetite. When its levels decrease, you have more difficulty feeling satisfied when you eat. This can cause you to eat more. It may also cause you to crave carbohydrates and sweets. The extra calories can lead to weight gain, leading to insulin resistance and diabetes.

Dr. Fleishman says that sleep apnea is a common problem now – about 15 to 30 percent of the population has it. It is more common in men than women. Signs of sleep apnea include: obesity, having a large neck and a round face, snoring and daytime sleepiness.

"If you have an issue with being sleepy or fatigued, then you should speak to your primary care physician," said Dr. Fleishman. "They can make a decision about whether you need further assessment. It's a very common problem, but it should be taken very seriously."

Dear friends and citizens of Cumberland County and Fayetteville: My name is Steve Stokes and I am a candidate for District Court Judge. I am committed to the public's assurance of a kind of equality and justice that is not familiar to some and stranger to others, but which is common to all.

My education, training and experience exemplify what a well-qualified District Court Judge should have. I earned a dual Master's degree in Public Administration and Management, and graduated from The Florida State University College of Law, where I was a Virgil Hawkins Fellow. I am licensed to practice law in North Carolina and Florida, and am admitted to practice before the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Florida, U.S. District for the Eastern District of North Carolina, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Armed Forces, and the U.S. Supreme Court. I possess the kind of judicial temperament and sense of fairness that will positively impact those who appear in my court. No one will walk away feeling that the court I presided over demeaned or disrespected them.

For twenty two years, I have worked as a lawyer in the private and public sectors as a prosecutor and defense attorney, in criminal, civil, military and administrative law areas. As an Officer and Lawyer, I honorably served in the U.S. Army Judge Advocate General's Corps as a Trial Counsel, a Special Assistant United States Attorney, Defense Attorney in the 82nd Airborne Division, and International Law Attorney for the U.S. Army Special Operations, Civil Affairs, and Psychological Operations Commands, respectively. I was Chief of the Army's largest legal assistance office. I was an Assistant State's Attorney. And I previously served as a Platoon Leader, Executive Officer, and Acting Commander with the 82nd Military Police Company, 82nd Airborne Division. I deployed to Cairo West, Egypt and Oman

Jordan in support of Operation Bright Star. I also deployed to Washington, DC part of a special security envoy during President Ronald Regan's first inauguration. My additional law enforcement experience includes having served as a deputy sheriff.

I graduated from the U.S. Army Ranger and Advanced Airborne Schools, earning the coveted Ranger Tab and Senior Jump Wings, respectively. I also graduated from the Combined Arms and Services Staff School at Fort Leavenworth, KS; the National Security Law Summer Institute at the University of Virginia School of Law; the U.S. Army Civil Affairs Advanced Course, JFK Special Warfare Center and School. I obtained the rank of Major before electing to leave the service to go into private practice. I have been a private practice attorney and small business owner for the past 15 years, while serving concurrently, for part of that

time, in the Army Reserves as a JAG officer at Fort Bragg.

I am President of the Cumberland County Bar Association and the Twelfth Judicial District Bar Association, with nearly 400 lawyers. In a 2012 peer survey conducted by the North Carolina Bar Association, of the four non-incumbent judicial candidates at that time, I ranked highest areas involving integrity and fairness, legal ability and professionalism, to name a few. I served on the Cumberland County Education Foundation's Board of Directors, and currently am a full board member of the Airborne and Special Operations museum.

I am a member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc., Alpha Phi Omega's National Service Fraternity, and am also a Master Mason. I have a broad and diverse array of interests which include playing chess, alto saxophone, creative writing, and practicing and teaching martial arts for over 30 years; I obtained the rank of Master, 6th degree black belt, and was a black belt lightweight weight champion in the state of Florida, and was listed as one of the top-30 black belt fighters in Florida.

I am married to Dr. Yvette Stokes, a pediatric dentist and owner of Highland Pediatric Dental. I have four children and one granddaughter. We are members of First Baptist Church. 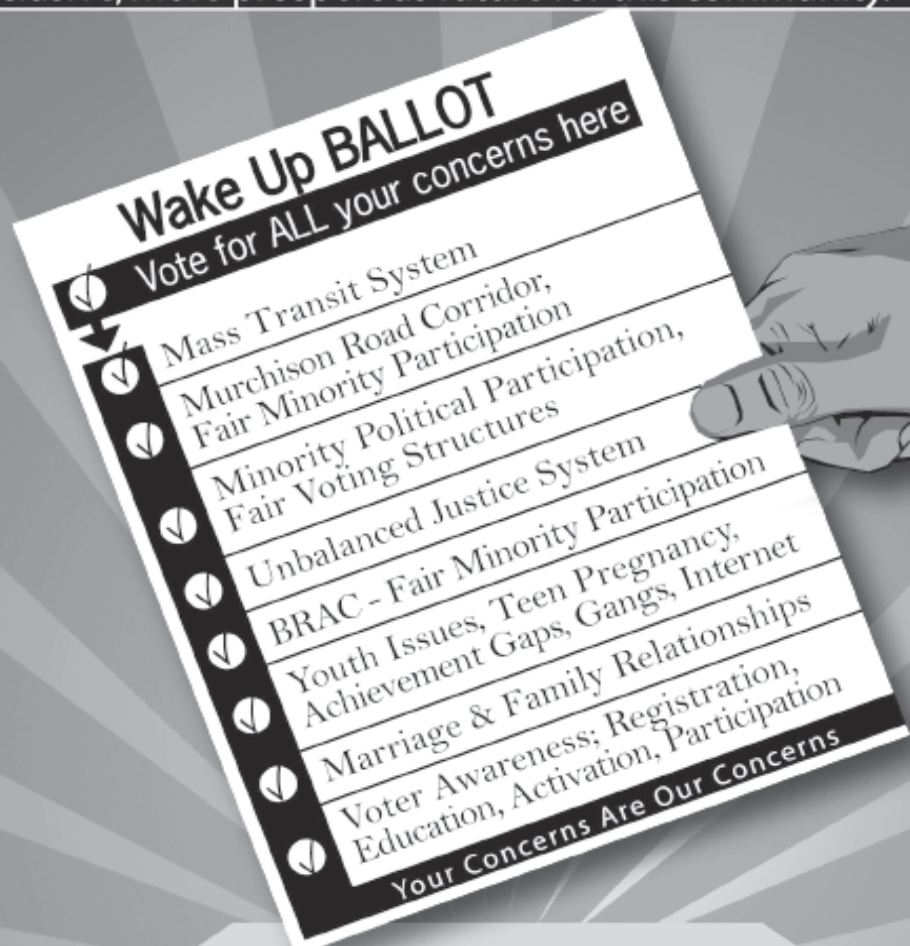

# Church News & More

## Dr. JOHN D. FULLER, SR.

*(Build a People and They Will Build a Church: God's Uncompromising Servant)*

### FROM HUMBLE BEGINNINGS

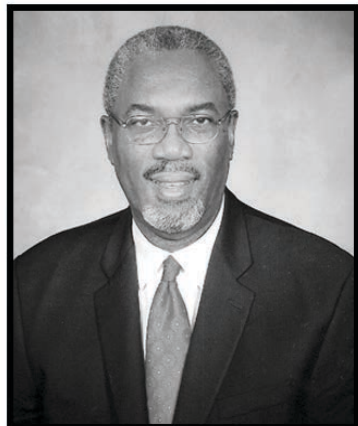
John D. Fuller, Sr., the son of the late Deacon Leon and Mrs. Pearlie Mae Fuller, was born May 23, 1946, in a "shotgun house" in Thomson, Georgia. The Fuller family sharecropped on forty acres of land in the Brier Creek Community of Thomson, Georgia. He appreciated the fact that though they were poor and struggling, they were a proud family.

He received his early education in the McDuffie County School System, Thomson, Georgia and graduated from R. L. Norris High School in 1965. Despite the many hardships, typical of a sharecropper's family, education was foremost in the mind of Rev. Fuller. As a young lad, he missed numerous days out of school while working with his father on the farm, but still maintained an "A" average.

### CALLING TO THE GOSPEL MINISTRY

John D. Fuller, Sr., was called to the ministry at the age of sixteen. On September 23, 1963, at the age of seventeen, he preached his initial sermon during a church business session at Jones Grove Baptist Church in Thomson, Georgia. His zeal for God and service caused Baptist Union Church in Hope Mills, North Carolina and Beauty Spot Baptist Church in Fayetteville, North Carolina to call him to pastor. The Union Baptist Association ordained him July 12, 1970. Despite pastoring both churches (Baptist Union and Beauty Spot), it was necessary financially for him to work full-time as the Day Care Coordinator of the Cumberland County Community Action Program, Inc. in 1973.

During the early years of 1973, Rev. Fuller was approached by a small committee from Lewis Chapel Missionary Baptist Church to discuss the

possibility of his becoming their pastor. He often visited the grounds of Lewis Chapel Church, and it was during the early part of the summer that he went to the back of the small building and knelt down on his knees and sincerely asked God for wisdom. Accordingly, he prayed this prayer: "Lord, if you, indeed, want me to pastor this church, give me a ministry for those who are not only presently here, but for those who could come to Lewis Chapel."

This youthful minister assumed the pastorate of Lewis Chapel Missionary Baptist Church the third Sunday in October 1973. In August 1974, Rev. Fuller resigned his job as Day Care Coordinator for Cumberland Community Action, Inc. to become a full-time pastor. This was done at a great sacrifice on the part of the pastor. Several members of the Church questioned his sanity over such a drastic move. One member stated, "It is nice of you to think so much of us to sacrifice all that money, but we won't have any to give you to make a difference." The Pastor simply replied that he had faith and trust in the Lord to see him through, for he was called to serve and obey.



### VISIONARY JOURNEY

Eleven months after Rev. Fuller's arrival at Lewis Chapel, groundbreaking ceremonies were held for the new facility. In late November of 1974, the Church began construction of a new church building. Such construction was completed through his skillful leadership in seven months. Through God's blessings and Rev. Fuller's leadership, our physical facilities were greatly improved. Numerous ministries and new auxiliaries had their beginning during this period.

Expansion of the Lewis Chapel Baptist Church facility continued with groundbreaking ceremonies being held in September 1980 for the addition of an education wing. The Olen Gerald Learning Center, named in honor of Deacon Olen Gerald, was formally dedicated on August 8, 1981. The growth was not just tremendous in the numerical and physical sense, but the spiritual realm. His charisma and enthusiasm for the work of God brought about the formation of an 8:30a.m. "Early Informal Worship Service," the first in Cumberland County. Each year, the church gained more than 150 members. Currently, there are four Worship Services, 7:15a.m., 8:30a.m., 11:00a.m. and 6:00p.m.

Rev. Fuller strongly encourages stewardship of time and talent. He also emphasizes the biblical principle of tithing. The Pastor's ministry is not only limited to the local congregation but extends to the local, state, national and global levels. He was the organizing president of the Ministers and Pastors Conference within the Union Baptist Association. He further served a four-year term as the President of the Union of Union Baptist Association.



### VISIONARY LEADERSHIP

**HANDLING YOUR DISAPPOINTMENTS SKILLFULLY**

A famous neurologist who has treated many cases of nervous breakdown says, "Frustration, feelings of futility and disappointment create such a heavy burden on the personality that many people give way under it." Then he adds, "People will be healthier, happier, and live more efficiently when they learn how to handle their disappointments skillfully." Let us learn and begin to practice that skill in this lesson.

1. Think of every disappointment as a message from God. He is trying by this means to tell you something. Perhaps He is saying, "No – that is not good for you; No – that is not the way to do it." You are bound to be disappointed if you do not do a thing in the right way. Only God is perfect rightness. If you are going at your problems in the wrong way, things are bound to go wrong, even though it is something you want to do. Therefore, if you suffer disappointment, it is wise to assume that the disappointment is a message from God. He is shaking His head and saying, "No – you haven't got it right."
2. Your disappointment may take the form of an unfulfilled hope, a frustrated ambition, the death of a loved one, or the failure of something at which you have worked diligently. It should still be regarded as a message from God, that the outcome is part of a plan which He regards as best, although disappointing to you. You will find peace and comfort and the right direction by acquiescing, without bitterness, to His will.
3. I suggest adopting the practice of a successful business woman who commits every day to God. Before she starts out in the morning, she puts the entire day in God's hands. As a result of this, she says that nothing can be a disappointment because whatever happens is according to His plan and will. It changes DIS-appointment to HIS appointment. The most wonderful things happen, she declares as a result of this plan of daily living Psalm 37:5 describes it thus: "Commit thy way unto the Lord; trust also in Him, and He shall bring it to pass."
4. In the previous point, we brought out the fact that Edison utilized his disappointments to advantage for he allowed each disappointment, by showing him how NOT to do it, to guide him to the way TO DO it. Therefore, keep yourself open to the plan God has for you. If, let us say, you suffer one disappointment after another, it is possible that you are trying to force open doors that God that does not want you to enter. Keep working at life prayerfully, then these disappointments or, as in the case of Edison, unsuccessful experiments will lead you to the right door.
5. Meditate on the meaning of the word disappointment. The prefix DIS denotes separation from. Used in connection with the word appointment, it means separation from your appointment. This implies that there is an appointment for you, but you have missed your appointment; hence, there is a DISappointment. The solution is to say to the Lord, quietly and humbly, "Lord, correct the error in me by which I have missed the appointment you have for me, and guide me to it."
