Dare to let go of and forgive the past. Stop saying that you have had a hard time in life. Stop talking about unhappy experiences. Stop trying to get sympathy. As long as you do this, you are still emotionally attached to that hard experience; you are continuing to feed it emotionally; you are keeping it alive. There is no room in your thoughts and feelings for a better experience.

Begin right now to say to yourself,

"I take only the good from each experience, past and present. I let the rest go"

Second: Start thinking about your life the way you want it to be.

The way to accept mentally your promised land is simply to change your point of view. Recognize another set of circumstances or events as possible; then dwell upon that possibility.

Caleb recognized another set of circumstances was possible when he urged, "Let us go up at once, and occupy it; for we are well able to overcome it."

Joshua and Caleb recognized another set of circumstances as possible when they said to the complainers, "The land, which we passed through... is an exceedingly good land. If the Lord delights in us, he will bring us into this land and give it to us, a land which flows with milk and honey." Please note that Joshua and Caleb did not claim they could take the Promised Land alone. They claimed God's help.

Right there in the wilderness, Joshua refused to be hypnotized by some of the appearances of the Promised Land, such as walled cities and hostile forces. Instead, he dared to realize that another set of events and circumstances was possible in spite of appearances. He then began to decree them, claiming God's help in making them possible. He used the law of mental acceptance.

Begin now to recognize that another set of circumstances and events is possible in your own life. Then ask God's help and affirm often, "Lord, I am ready!" If you really are ready, mentally and emotionally, to accept greater good, it will come very soon. And once it starts, you cannot stop it; you have to flow along with it. So be sure you mean it when you say, "Lord, I am ready."
