## RICK GLAZIER Has Been a Fighter for Our Community, And He's Just Getting Started.

Representative Rick Glazier is a **civil rights attorney** who works in our neighborhoods to keep all of our families secure and our community prospering. Rick helped overturn the wrongful conviction of Lesly Jean, a former Marine who served nine years in jail for a violent crime he didn't commit. He represented Lesly Jean for free during his nine-year appellate process, and afterward, he successfully lobbied the state legislature to enact the law that will help protect others from enduring a similar fate.

Rep. Glazier wrote the law making North Carolina the first state in the country to establish an **Actual Innocence Commission**, giving the wrongly-convicted a chance to have their cases heard again. He also led the fight to cut down on bad convictions based on false witness, and to pass **North Carolina's Racial Justice Act**, tackling the problem of racial bias in convictions.

Rick Glazier visits every school in Cumberland County, every year, so he can see firsthand what our teachers and students need. He fought against the Republican's billion dollar cuts to our schools, and is working to keep college affordable. And, he led the charge to keep quality manufacturing jobs in our area. Rick's experience on the Jean case, his years as a visiting **professor of criminal justice at FSU**, and his belief in basic human decency have made him a **champion of civil rights, justice and equality for all**.
