Freshman center is third Lady Bronco player to receive a CIAA award this year

HAMPTON, Va. – The Fayetteville State Lady Broncos continue to accumulate the accolades this basketball season.

For the third time in a month, the Lady Broncos were honored with a weekly CIAA award. This time, freshman center Bria Robinson was named as the league's Rookie of the Week after her strong performance in Fayetteville State's game against Barton on Saturday.

Robinson, who had set a career-high in points scored a week earlier, nearly matched that mark with her team-high 16 points against Barton. But she also pulled down a career-high 12 rebounds to lead all players in the game. The 6-foot-4 center from Belmont, N.C., shot 50 percent from the field and also blocked two shots, leading the Lady Broncos in points, rebounds and blocks against Barton.

Robinson is the third Lady Bronco player to receive a league award already this season. Transfers Akysia Resper and Tashama Banner have each garnered nods as conference Newcomers of the Week.

F S U ' S CONCEPCION, MOORE AND BAILEY NAMED CIAA ALL-ROOKIE

Broncos land three on list, second-most in CIAA
HAMPTON, Va. – The future appears bright for the Fayetteville State Broncos football program.

The Broncos landed three players on the CIAA All-Rookie team.

Quarterback Chauncey Concepcion, who took over as the starter midway through the season and led the Broncos to a 4-2 record in games in which he took the majority of the snaps, joined linebacker Steven Moore and safety Kwamere Bailey as All-Rookie selections.

Concepcion (Charlotte, N.C.) finished the season passing for a team-high 799 yards to go with five touchdowns. He also ranked second on the team in rushing, with 336 yards. Concepcion was named as the league's Rookie of the Week in Week 10.

Moore (Chapel Hill, N.C.) was one of the most devastating defenders in the CIAA this season, racking up 36 tackles, including a team-high 12.5 tackles for loss, which ranked fifth in the CIAA. He also led the Broncos with 5.5 sacks and had a 37-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown.

Bailey (Manteo, N.C.) matured quickly in the Broncos' secondary, finishing with 31 tackles for a team that ranked among the league's best in pass defense efficiency. He added a 70-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown and also had a forced fumble this season.
